The COVID-19 pandemic, like the economic crisis of 2008, has shown a higher degree of uncertainty and the powerful impact of crises on economic systems and social development as a whole. Under these conditions, the role and importance of futures research is increasing, with the aim of improving planning, better utilising the opportunities and potential of countries, and also more efficiently responding to future challenges and shocks. The scenario method was developed to empower policy creators and society in general to respond to changes in a timely manner. The Scenario Analysis method has been in use for both long-term and mid-term planning for more than half a century, in both the private and the public sector.
